News from the Measurer Ed Brainard: The Measurer has collected three years of potential updates for rules of Shields Class including various items from Shields owners, fleet measurers and sail makers. These items are being consolidated into recommended changes in the measurement rules by the National Officers and will be circulated at the end of the winter to the membership for approval. It is hoped that answers to many of the questions that have arisen over the last three years will be made clear by the proposed modifications to the rules and make the class continue as a leading national one design fleet.

Dues: News from the Treasurer: Nick Baker, Treasurer, reports that reminders concerning dues for the current year have recently been mailed to all fleet treasurers. According to the class By-laws, dues are payable by the first of July each year. Don't be surprised now if your treasurer gets the annual dues notices out a bit earlier than usual this year. Your national treasurer plans to compile a listing of individual members, broken down into both active and associate categories, which will be published as a supplement to the Class Book.

Monterey Bay reported by Bob Coffin: The fleet is purchasing new tri-radial spinnakers from the North loft in Alameda, California. We have always used radial head prior to this purchase, and we will be interested in seeing the difference in performance.

Shields #186, "Barbara" (named for Corny Shields daughter, Barbara McNitt) was located by a Navy minesweeper which was visiting Monterey. As "Barbara" has been on the bottom of Monterey Bay since March 1980 in about 120' of water and her owners, the Navy Sailing Association of the Navy Postgraduate School, had not been successful in locating her, finding her was a great triumph. Several divers from the School went down and fastened lifting gear to "Barbara" and the minesweeper lifted her to the surface. She is now undergoing a thorough survey. She is in amazingly good condition after her long ordeal.

The Monterey Bay Fleet will conduct a 20 race series for the Fleet Championship. The Fleet races on five weekends with two races on Saturday and two on Sunday. The series starts on the 11 - 12 of April and continues with one weekend each month finally ending on August 1 - 2. The winners of this series qualify for the Nationals.

The Fleet, along with the Monterey Peninsula Y acht Club, is planning match and team racing among the several yacht club and college and other sailing associations on Monterey Bay. Most of the racing will be done in Shields. We are expecting a lot of good publicity for the Shields Fleet as the result of these matches.

Narragansett Bay reported by Chuck Roberts: Fleet #9 held their annual meeting on November 16. At this meeting it was decided to have 5 spring, 12 summer and 5 fall series races with double races on some dates to have at least one open (no race) weekend per month. It was unanimous that the Shields fleet should be the first class to start before J-24's.

There was general interest in adopting a compulsory insurance program. The major obstacle is that the Navy has been unable to obtain such a policy for their institutionally owned Shields. It was agreed further investigation be undertaken to obtain a fleet group policy to include all individually owned boats and the Navy.

Proposed rule changes: Mike Bonovino, Gary Lash and Bob Berglund expressed a desire to loosen up the Class rules on the following: Back stay adjustment; Spinnaker halyard; outhaul; Cockpit post for mainsail trim; get okay to buy a new bare hull. (Cape Cod Ship has refused to sell bare hulls.)

Corrections in last Masthead - with apologies:

## By-laws Updated:

The recently printed copies of the Shields Class By-Laws, distributed with the October issue of the Masthead, have been up-dated as follows:

- (a) Under Article 3.5, Applications and Dues, these words have been deleted: "...except that the dues for Active Members and Associate Members for 1974 shall be payable one-half on July 1 and one-half on November 1 of that year."
- (b) Under Article 8.6, National Championship Regatta, Rules, the words "United States" have been substituted for the words "North American."
- (c) Under Article 8.9, National Championship Regatta, Courses, the words "United States" have been substituted for the words "North American."

The Governing Board of the National Shields Class earnestly believes these changes will in no way adversely affect the intent or
meaning of the By-laws as originally written. Unless any objections
have been expressed towards any of the national officers within a
reasonable period of time, it will be assumed that the newly published
By-laws have been accepted as written and duly ratified by the membership.
