Ralph Thacher Memorial Trophy: This trophy was proposed by Bryan J. McSweeny at the New England Association 1980 Winter Dinner Meeting. It is a very fine old sailing trophy that Bryan found in an antique store. On one side of the trophy is an engraving of a sailboat; on the other - Ralph Thacher Memorial Trophy has been newly engraved. Winners are listed on a silver plaque constructed for the base. The prize made possible by contributions from many friends is awarded annually to that person who has made a special contribution to the New England Shields fleet in the spirit with which Ralph Thacher participated in the past." The first selection committee composed of representatives from the New England fleet were as follows: Dan Hadley (Newport), Newt Clemson (Marblehead), Walter Eberstadt (Edgartown), Joan Thacher Tiffany and Brett Thacher (Marion). The trophy was awarded at the New England Association Winter Meeting to: Cornelius Shields (1980) and Frank Scully (1981). It was felt that these two men had not only contributed to the class on a National level, but also had made the development of the class in New England possible. It was with great appreciation for all of their work and leadership that this award was given to Corny and Frank.

Recommendations for By-law changes: Ed Brainard, National Measurer using his experience as Measurer has developed recommendations for changes in the By-laws. Fleet #5 Seawanhaka Corinthian: Reported by Vic Onet.

A team from Seawanhaka, representing the United States, defended the English Speaking Union Trophy June 22 -26 against four teams of skilled yachtsmen and crew from the British Commonwealth: England, Australia, Bermuda and New Zealand. John Sheffield, helmsman, Duncan Sterling and Mark McDonald represented Seawanhaka and the United States. Australia's team with Dick Mobs at the helm won the closely contested series. The USA was second and

Bermuda third. Unusually fast moving weather systems (south to northwest to south and back to northwest in five days) provided good breezes for every day of racing with winds from 10 to 35 knots. The round robin series culminated with the U.S. winning the last race appearing to have won the series, until Australia pulled ahead of New Zealand after a tacking duel at the finish, thereby, winning the necessary points to wrap up the trophy. In September the "Island Cup Series" team race will be held with the English. The Long Island District Championships were won by Mrs. Katherine (Kitten) Gahægan and her son Lex (who ran foredeck on Freedom) and son Robin.
